






- 1. What are my career options?

# Career & Technical Ed. (CTE)

- Can be shorter programs (ex. 6 12 months)
- Many CTE programs offered at community colleges, which low-income students can often attend for free!
- Programs prepare students for good-paying jobs in specific industries
- Routes to skilled professions
- Financial aid is available

Example: Earn a Plumbing Technology certificate at L.A. Trade Tech and make \$60,000!

# PROPRIETARY OR FOR-PROFIT (PRIVATE) VOCATIONAL SCHOOLS


- Costs more than community college (CC) programs
  - i.e. DeVry \$497 per credit vs. CC \$46 per credit
- High rates of student debt
- Poor job outcomes
- Some are under federal investigation or have lost accreditation
  - i.e., Corinthian operated school, ITT Technical Institute, and Cordon Bleu



# Financial Aid Availability and Requirements for CTE programs at Community Colleges

- CA College Promise Grant (BOG fee waiver) available for short and longer programs
- Federal aid requires high school diploma & enrollment in a certificate program of at least one year
- Foster youth may also qualify for the Chafee Grant- up to \$5,000
- Independent Living Programs (ILP) for eligible foster youth may provide funds to help with the costs of materials and equipment
- Each community college should have a foster youth and homeless youth liaison. See the California College Pathways website for the college campus contacts.

#### or

- Enroll in a college with an "Ability to Benefit program"
  - Enables earning a HS diploma while earning a CE certificate



### Living Wage Calculation for Riverside County, California

The living wage shown is the hourly rate that an **individual** must earn to support their family, if they are the sole provider and are working full-time (2080 hours per year). All values are **per adult in a family** unless otherwise noted. The state minimum wage is the same for all individuals, regardless of how many dependents they may have. The poverty rate is typically quoted as gross annual income. We have converted it to an hourly wage for the sake of comparison.

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





### Students with disabilities

- Emphasize that college is an option
- IEP/504 plan not required to access services
- Create connections
  - Disability Services Programs and Services (DSPS) at colleges
  - DSPS registration and accommodations
  - Include DSPS on campus tours
  - Introduce available resources at colleges
  - Invite DSPS staff &/or counselors to county events/meetings
- Strength based vs. deficit based





# State of Apprenticeship


- Over 80,000 registered apprentices
- O Over 600 State Registered Occupations
- C Largest State Apprenticeship Program in the Nation



# What makes an Apprenticeship?

Apprenticeship has 2 main components

- On-the-Job Training
- O Classroom Instruction



### Classroom Instruction

- Related Supplemental Instruction (RSI)
- O Recommended 144 hours per year
- Theory and Background
- Understanding the reasons behind the task
- O Class instruction is tuition free



# On-the-Job Training

- O Work Processes
- O Schedule of tasks
- O Minimum of 2,000 hours
- Qualified Supervision
- O Paid every hour with increase(s)




# The Apprenticeship Model

- 2000 OJT Hours Minimum (Work Processes)
- 144 Recommended Hours RSI
- Wage Schedule
- Journey to Apprentice Ratio
- Apprenticeship Committee
- Selection Procedure



# The On-the-Job Training Model

- 500-2000 On-the-Job Training Hours (Work Processes)
- O Wage Schedule
- O Journey to Trainee Ratio
- Selection Procedure
- O No RSI Component
- O May be completed in 3 months



### Benefits for the Youth

- **O AB 12** 
  - Meets Education and Employment Participation Conditions for Extended Foster Care Eligibility
- O Many Opportunities to Earn a Living Wage
  - O May be State or Local Minimum
- O Alternative Education and Career Pathway
- C Earning While Learning
- O Regular Pay Increase
