

Financial Aid Makes a Difference



High School seniors that complete the FAFSA are *63% more likely* to enroll in higher education

Students receiving at least \$7,500 in financial aid

49% transferred or graduated

Students receiving \$1,000 to \$2,500

17% transferred or graduated

Impact of COVID-19 on College Matriculation



Enrollment deposits have decreased by **6 %** overall among students with the most financial need—

- For Black students in the lower income bracket, deposits are down by **12 %**.

FAFSA filings have decreased by **4 %** overall

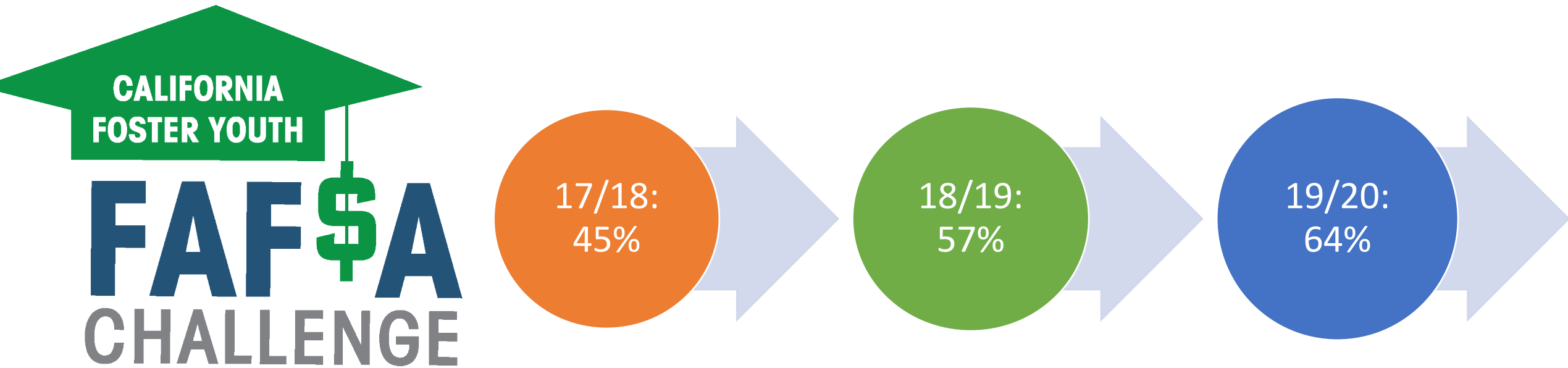
- **17.5%** for Black students and **14.9 %** for Latinx students in the lower bracket.

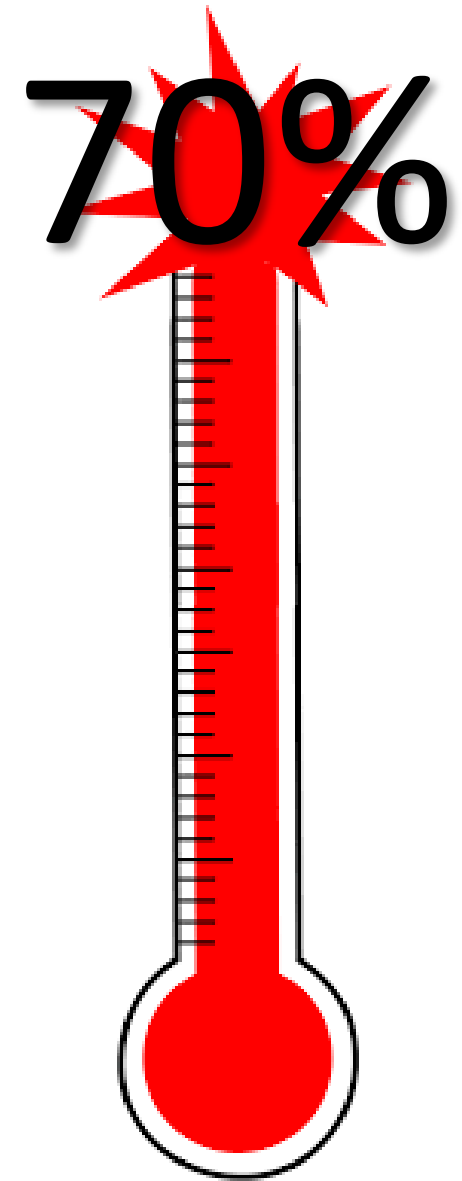

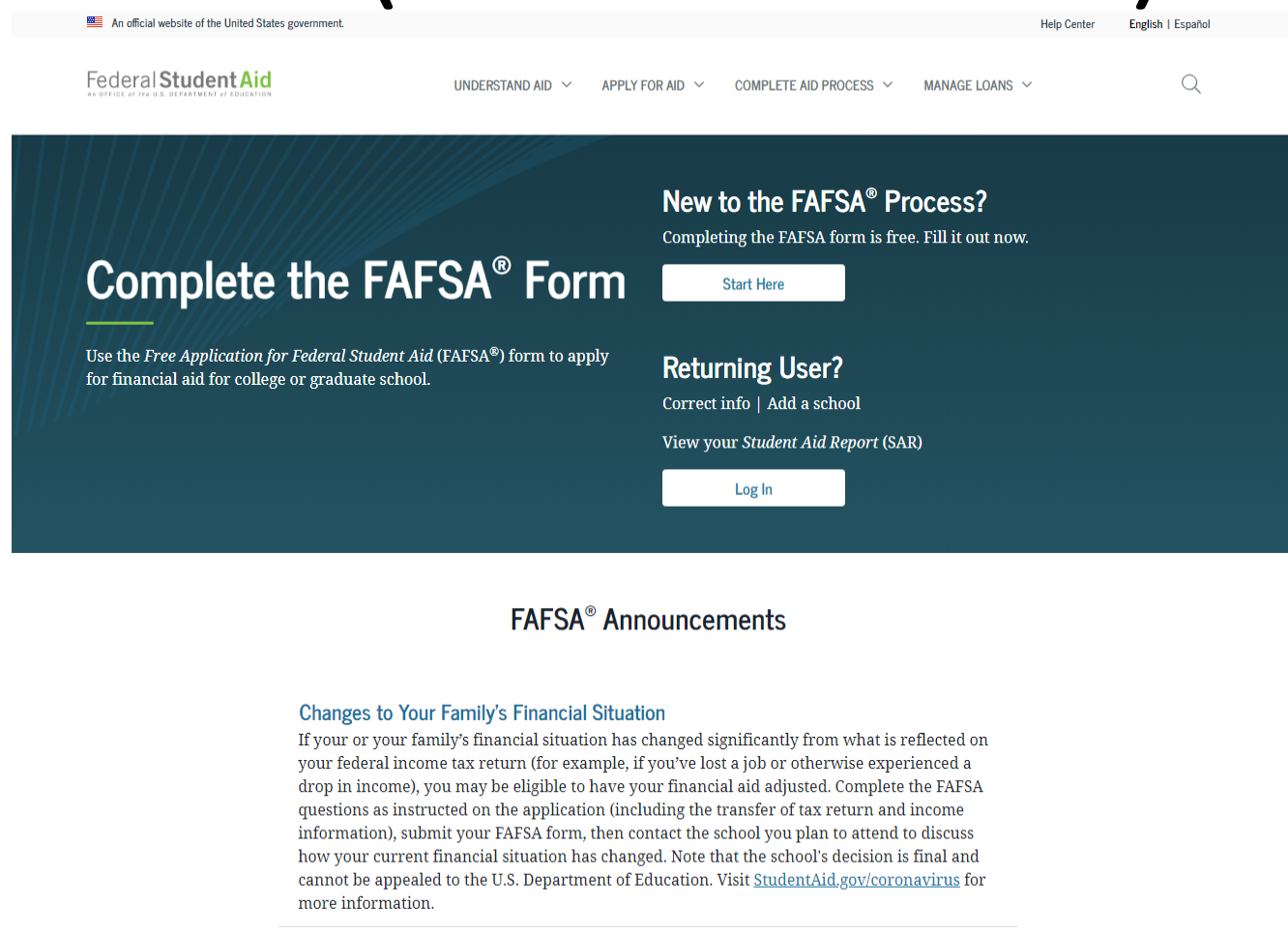

CA Dream Act Application: Eligibility Requirements

Time and Coursework:

Option A:

3 years HS Credits and 3 years total in attendance at any of these schools in CA



- Elementary School
- Middle School
- High School

Option B (SB 68):

3 years attendance (or equivalent) at any of these schools in CA



- High School
- Adult School
- Community College (Max. 2 years may be applied towards 3-year requirement)

Special Immigration Juvenile Status (SIJS)

Undocumented children involved in adoption or guardianship proceedings who have been adopted, abused or neglected may be able to obtain SIJS and apply to become a lawful permanent resident (LPR)

If an undocumented student does not have an application for SIJS pending, contact the child welfare agency

A pending application for SIJS does not make you eligible for federal financial aid

When to Apply for FAFSA or CADAA

Priority application period is **October 1 – March 2nd** before the start of the school year that you will begin college

Students can apply before they submit college applications

Some colleges may have earlier priority deadlines

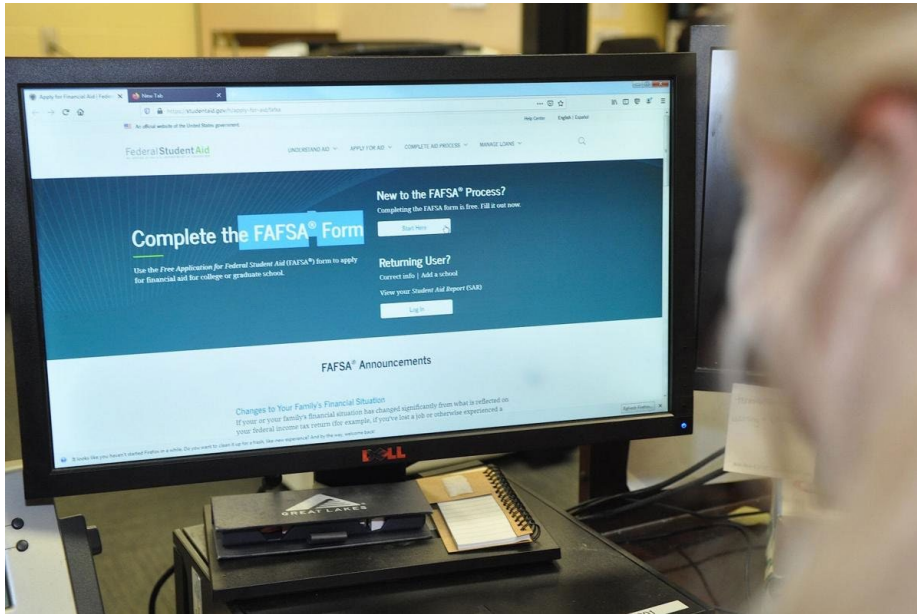

Tips for FAFSA Assistance in a Virtual World



Utilize Zoom, Teams and other video platforms to share screens

Make individual appointments for one-on-one assistance to complete the applications

Provide high-touch intrusive support- sending an email isn't enough

Start the process early to support youth with the applications

Provide incentives

Reminder: The FAFSA must be filled out EVERY year! This is a FREE application.

Changes to Your Family's Financial Situation

If your or your family's financial situation has changed significantly from what is reflected on your federal income tax return (for example, if you've lost a job or otherwise experienced a drop in income), you may be eligible to have your financial aid adjusted. 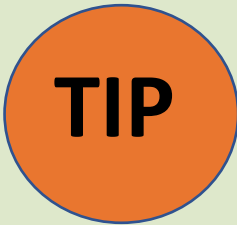




WebGrants To Do's

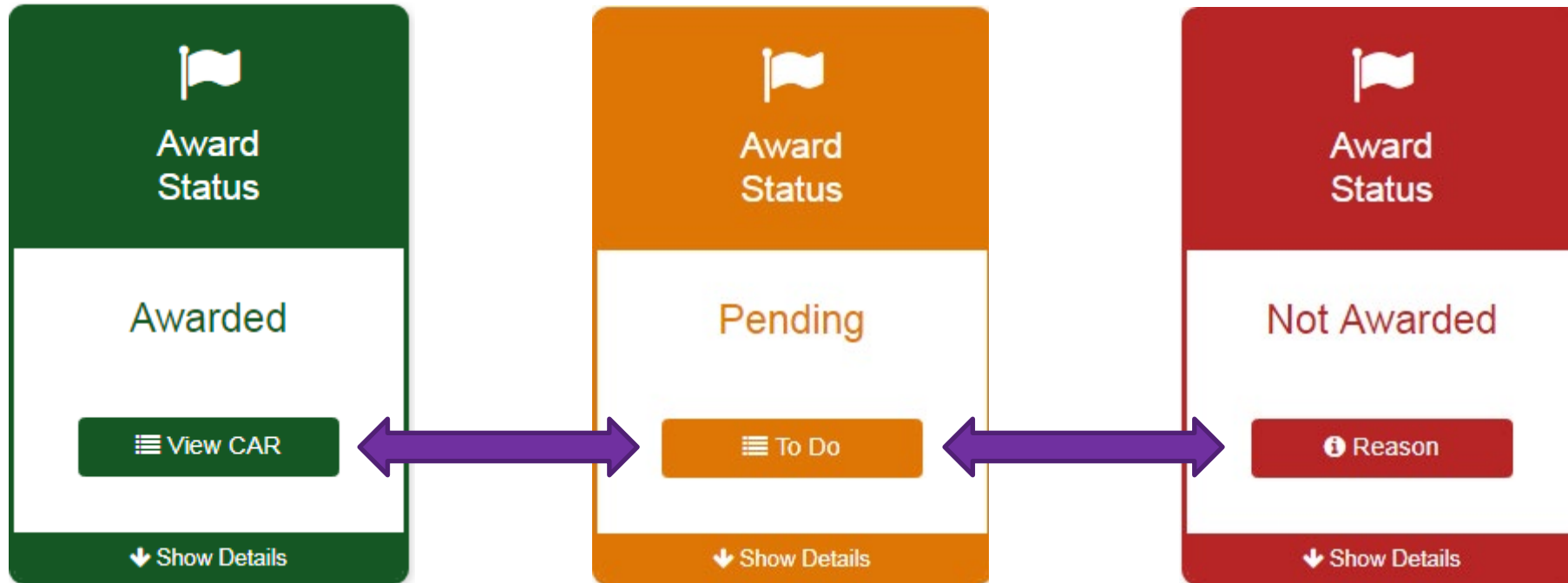
