A Step-by-step Guide to Filing Your Own Taxes






The purpose of this guide is to walk you through the process of filing your taxes from beginning to end for free with the support of an IRS-certified tax preparer on the TaxSlayer free filing site.

Self-filing is a good option for young adults who:

- are filing a current year tax return (2022),
- are comfortable using online tax software,
- want to learn how to file on their own, and
- have earned less than \$73,000 in 2022.






Beginning this year, current and former foster youth may be eligible for the Foster Youth Tax Credit (FYTC) worth up to \$1,083.

For more info on how to claim this credit, please see "STEP SEVEN: Prepare your California State Tax Return" beginning on slide 37.





STEP ONE

Create an account with MyFreeTaxes.org



- Go to MyFreeTaxes.org
- Click "FILE ON MY OWN"
- Scroll to enter your contact information
- Click "GET STARTED FILING"






- If you aren't automatically redirected to a form – click the orange button that says it will redirect you
- Fill out your income, zip code, and select that you are not a resident of Puerto Rico
- Click FILE NOW



You should have been redirected to MyFreeTaxes.com for the next step to filing your taxes. If the new window doesn't open, click here.



- You will now leave the MyFreeTaxes.org page and be directed to the TaxSlayer VITA/TCE self-prep kiosk page
- Click FILE NOW
- Click the CONTINUE button to create a TaxSlayer Account
- Go on to Step 2






STEP TWO

Create an account with TaxSlayer – the free IRS self-filing website.




- Click "CREATE ACCOUNT"

 - Note: Save your username and password in a secure place with your tax documents
 - Note: You can log in and out of your tax account as you work on your return.
 - Note: You do not need to enter all the information at one time.
- Click CREATE ACCOUNT






 CONTINUE to begin your 2022 tax return.










STEP THREE

Login to TaxSlayer and begin self-filing your 2022 tax return personal information.





- Login to TaxSlayer using your username and password.
- Type your full name into the box.
- If you are married and filing jointly: check the box
- If you are not married: leave the checkbox blank
- Click CONTINUE







- If you have last year's tax
 return you can upload it and
 click View Results
- If not, click SKIP
- Type in your personal information
 - Double check spelling and numbers
 - Enter your personal information as it is written on your Social Security Card or Individual Taxpayer Identification Number






- Enter your mailing address.
- If you do not have a mailing address ask a shelter, clinic, or youth center to use their address and use that information.
- For residency status select Full-Year of the State if you lived in California the whole year.
- If you moved to California in 2023 and lived in a different state in 2022 select Full-Year Resident of Another State
- If you lived in multiple states select Part-Year State Resident






- Check any checkbox that is true for you or leave them blank
- The most common are if you are in college as a full time student or if someone else can claim you on their taxes such as a caregiver, parent or guardian who is providing for your costs for the year.
- Make sure to check the last box that you qualify for the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) as a current or former foster youth, college student, or experienced homelessness or risk of homelessness.



- Select your filing status
 (Click the filing status wizard if
 you are unsure)
- Click YES or NO to claim dependents on your return
 - If you are a custodial parent or guardian to a child or relative click YES and enter the child(ren)'s information
 - If not, click NO.
- If you have experienced Identity
 Theft or Tax Fraud and the IRS
 has provided you with a six-digit
 Identity Protection Pin select YES
- If not, select NO



- Make sure your personal information is all spelled and entered correctly
- Click EDIT if anything needs to be reentered and click
 CONTINUE when it is all correct
- Click CONTINUE to enter your work and income information







STEP FOUR

Enter your income if you had earned income, college scholarships or were self-employed. This includes tax documents such as W-2, 1099-NEC or MISC, 1098-T etc. This also includes unemployment income from 1099-G forms.





- You can add your tax forms quickly with Quick File if you know which forms you need Click CONTINUE.
 - If you don't know which forms you need select
 "I do not know"
- Click either:
 - I want to be guided or
 - Select my forms if you already have all of your documents ready
- If you do not have any income from jobs, scholarships, retirement, or other select SKIP INCOME
- To qualify for the Foster Youth Tax
 Credit you need to have at least
 \$1 in earned income





- If you had a part-time, full-time, or seasonal job as an employee you will have a <u>W-2</u> from each job you had in 2022
 - Enter the tax document information from every job that provided you with a W-2
- Type in the information from your W-2 exactly as it is on your tax document and click CONTINUE
- Select Enter another W-2 if you had more than one job in 2022





- If you received unemployment compensation in 2021 you should have a 1099-G form
- Click YES and CONTINUE on Unemployment Compensation and enter the information from the form OR Click NO and CONTINUE
- If you sold stocks, bonds or other property click YES and CONTINUE to enter your 1099-B form
- Otherwise Click NO and CONTINUE



Common sales reported here are:


- Stocks, bonds, and mutual funds (you typically receive Form 1099-B for these transactions)
- · Collectibles, antiques, coins, art, gems, and stamps
- · Main or second home (losses not allowed for sale of main home)
- Other personal property, such as cars, computers, etc. (losses not allowed for these types of property)



- If you sold stocks, bonds or other property click YES and CONTINUE to enter your 1099-B form
- Enter your transactions.
- Some systems do not automatically provide a 1099-B form to you. You may need to use a system like Coin Tracker or a similar service that will summarize your sales.
 Some of these are free and some are paid services.



- If you were a half-time or full-time student at a technical or trade school or college enter your tax information from your 1098-T
- Click YES for additional income qualified education programs
- Click YES Other Compensation Taxable scholarships and grants
- Click Begin Scholarships and Grants > Enter the amount
- Use this spreadsheet below to add up your qualified tuition, books, and fees then subtract those costs from your total scholarships received to know how much to enter into other income





- If you worked as a contractor or gig worker or selfemployed enter the information from your forms 1099-MISC or 1099-NEC
- Use the spreadsheet below to add up your qualified business expenses for 2021
- Spreadsheet to calculate
 business expenses




- If you worked for cash go to the lncome section of the Federal return.
- Click Begin on Less Common Income
- Click Begin on Other Income
 Not Reported Elsewhere
- Select "Other Income" from the dropdown menu
- Enter how much money you earned into the box
- Check the box that the income was Earned





STEP FIVE

Maximize your refund by entering in credits and deductions like donations to charity, school expenses, business expenses and more. You may need to look at bank statements and receipts to get the most money possible.



- Deductions help reduce
 what you owe in taxes
 and some provide you
 with a cash back
 refund.
- Find Deductions in the Federal section of the return after Income.
- EVERYONE Click "I want to be guided."





- Custodial parents and former foster youth ages 25+ may qualify for the **Earned Income Tax Credit.**
- EVERYONE CLICK YES to explore the possible credits and deductions related to you and your family if you have children.


Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC)

Do you want to explore possible credits and deductions related to you and your family?

The EITC is automatically calculated based on the income and personal information you entered. Select Yes if one of the following situations applies to you:

- · You have been previously disallowed the EITC but wish to file it on this year's tax return
- · You are a member of clergy and have eligible income to exclude from the EITC calculation
- · You are currently ineligible for the EITC











- Click **YES** that you would like to explore credits & deductions.
- Click YES that you paid qualifying education expenses
- Click YES that you have completed entering your income information
- Select your student NAME
- Answer the questions about your 1098-T form. If you do not have the form, you can request it from your educational institution.




- Enter the School Information from the 1098-T. Click Continue.
- If your expenses are more than your schloarship amount enter the information for Tuition Paid (Box 1), Grants (Box 5) and Other Qualifying Expenses (books and supplies you paid for out of your own bank account. Click Continue
- If your grants are more than your expenses and you added your grants and scholarships described in Step 4 of this guide leave the middle box Grants blank here. Fill in the information from Tuition Paid (Box 1), and Other Qualifying Expenses (books and supplies you paid for out of your own bank account. Click Continue








- Confirm that you are eligible for the American Opportunity Tax Credit by answering the four eligibility questions.
- Select that you are eligible for the American Opportunity Tax Credit by clicking on the box.
- Click CONTINUE.



STEP SIX

Answer the Health Insurance - Affordable
Care Act Insurance Plan Question

- Click NO if you have full-scope Medi-Cal coverage or have insurance through your employer
- Click YES if you paid for health insurance using Covered
 California












- Click NO if you were insured through work or Medi-Cal
- Click YES if you paid for insurance through Covered California
- CA Renter's Credit: Click
 YES if you paid rent in CA for at least 6 months of the year.
 - It doesn't matter if it is a little amount or through a public program - if you pay monthly rent select YES.





- Wait! You are not done with the California return.
- Click YES to go to the main
 California Return page
- California Return: Click EDIT
 on the Credits section to claim
 the Foster Youth Tax Credit.



CA Foster Youth Tax Credit

Foster Youth Tax Credit Eligibility

A qualified taxpayer that is at least 18 years old and younger than 26 years old as of the last day of the taxable year and is one who was in foster care while 13 years of age or older in an AFDC-FC placement, as described in Section 11402 of the Welfare and Institutions Code (AFDC-FC placements include an approved home a relative, a nonrelative extended family member, a licensed family home of a nonrelative, a licensed group home or short-term residential therapeutic placement, the home of a nonrelated legal guardian, a transitional housing placement for minors or a transitional housing placement for nonminor dependents, an out of state group home, a supervised independent living placement), including a tribally approved home, as defined in subdivision (r) of Section 224.1 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, or Approved Relative Caregiver Funding Program eligible placement, as described in Article 6 (commencing with Section 11450) of Chapter 2 of Part 3 of Division 9 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, by a Title IV-E agency, pursuant to a voluntary placement agreement or a juvenile court order.

Is the Taxpayer eligible for the Foster Youth Tax Credit?



Taxpayer - Do you give consent and authorize the California Department of Social Services to share limited information about you with the California Franchise Tax Board for purposes of verifying your eligibility for the FYTC?



- CA Foster Youth Tax Credit (scroll down):
- If your name changed since you were in foster care type in your first, middle initial, and last name while in foster care.
 - This is so you can be verified correctly.

• Otherwise leave it blank.

California Return CA Foster Youth Tax Credit

If the Taxpayer's name was different while in foster care than name on tax return (FTB relies on the information entered on the tax return to verify taxpayer eligibility for the credit), enter that information below:

Taxpayer's First Name while in foster care if different than what is on the tax return
Taxpayer's Middle Initial while in foster care if different than what is on the tax return
Taxpayer's Last Name while in foster care if different than what is on the tax return

- CA Foster Youth Tax Credit (scroll down):
- Click Begin: If you have proof of foster care (verification letter or ward of the court letter).
- Upload the PDF letter and click DONE.

CA Foster Youth Tax Credit

If you are providing consent above, you may attach to this return a PDF letter issued by a county or state agency confirming each individual who claims the FYTC status as a foster youth at or after age 13, or other proof of status as a condition of receiving the FYTC. Below are samples of other proof/supporting documentation that may be provided:





- CDSS Foster Care Verification Form
- County-issued Letter

If consent and/or the proof you submit does not result in satisfactory proof of your eligibility, you may be contacted to provide additional proof, which may delay a decision on your eligibility.



A decision on your eligibility for the FYTC may be delayed or denied if your eligibility is not confirmed by CDSS or you do not provide satisfactory proof of your eligibility to the FTB. For that reason, we recommend that you check the applicable box to provide your consent and/or attach proof of your status as a foster youth at or after age 13 to your tax return.








- Click Back

- Make sure to enter any additional information that may apply to your personal circumstances on your State Return
 - Review your Total Income, Tax
 Credits and Refund Amounts.
- Make sure you double check that the Earned Income Tax Credit, Child Tax Credit, Education Credits, and California EITC, Young Child Tax Credit, Foster Youth Tax Credit and Renters Credit are all in the summary.
 - Click View Return







- File Your Return > Click Yes
- Make sure you have your Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) from the prior year tax return which allows you to file your return electronically.
- If you do not know your AGI you add up how much money you earned last year.

Ready to file?

If you're done with all the returns you need to file, we can get some final details and finish up!

Are you ready to keep going?

- Yes, I'm done with my return(s) and ready to file!

No, I'm not ready.

CHECK THE STATUS OF YOUR RETURN

When your Federal and/or state return(s) have been processed, an automatic notification is sent to the e-mail address associated with your account as well as to the mailbox within your account located in the navigation menu on the left side of the screen. If you did not receive the e-mail notification, please be sure to add TaxSlayer to your safe senders list so that our messages are not delivered to your SPAM or JUNK folder.

Once your Federal and/or state return(s) have been accepted, you will be able to login to your account from the TaxSlayer homepage and access your accepted Federal and/state return(s) directly from the "My Account" screen shown under the "Return Status" tab.

You will click on the print button to print your returns.

SAVE YOUR FILES & KEEP THEM SAFE

Save a copy of your return and your tax documents and receipts on a password protected computer or print a copy and save your return in a locked filing cabinet along with your tax documents.

FILING AN AMENDED TAX RETURN

Did you already file but need to file an Amendment? You may have missed a document, chosen the wrong filing status, not claimed a dependent, or missed a credit or deduction. If so - follow the directions here to correct your tax return. https://www.taxslayer.com/tax-tools/tax-amendments
